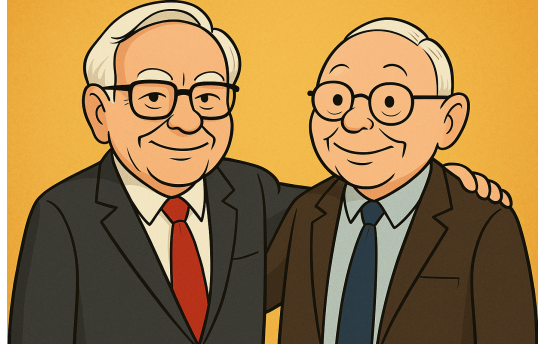


## Warren Buffett and Charlie Munger
